To all of our Veterans and supporters,

We're wrapping up another great year of serving Veterans. and we know it cannot happen without all of you! We've had the privilege of conducting two flights this year, flying over 160 Veterans to Washington, D.C. to see their memorials. Since the inception of Honor Flight Bluegrass in 2008, we have flown over 2,500 Veterans. We know, and you know, our job is not complete until we fly all the WWII, Korean War, and Vietnam Veterans who want to go.

We are a bit different from other Honor Flight hubs because we try to get together with our Veterans outside of the actual flights. It is important to all of us to keep history alive and honor special days. Our Veterans love the fellowship with other Veterans, so we try to bring them together as much as possible, whether it be Victory in Europe Day or a Veteran's 90th birthday.

We are also truly blessed with such a great, dedicated volunteer base that loves and admires our Veterans! From cheering on the Veterans at the airport as they are welcomed home to simply sending a letter of thanks or a birthday card to them. Every bit of time, treasure, or talent our volunteers bring to the table helps us carry out the mission.

As we plan our 2024 flying season, we hope to get back to flying three flights a year as we have in previous years. With that said, it takes an enormous amount of funding, approximately \$117,000 for each flight. Our guardians pay their way, but it leaves about \$80,000 to raise for our Veterans to travel "all expenses paid." It is a tall order each year, and we are always looking for ways to raise money. 






















3RD ANNUAL CAR SHOW

V-J DAY • SEPT. 2ND

On August 14, 1945, it was announced that Japan had surrendered unconditionally to the Allies, effectively ending World War II. September 2nd is recognized as "Victory Over Japan Day," or simply "V-J Day," because it was when the formal surrender took place aboard the U.S.S. Missouri, anchored in Tokyo Bay. Our WWII Veterans know this day well, so we always recognize it and bring them together for it. This year, we had 10 WWII Veterans and a convoy with KILROY military vehicles in attendance!

He was a prisoner for 31 months, so can you imagine what that Welcome Home meant to him. Thank you to all who came out.
