



B25 BARNSTORMING

Honor Flight Bluegrass hosted "Show Me," a WWII B-25 Twin Engine Bomber on a barnstorming tour across Kentucky on June 18, 19, and 20th. With the help of the Kentucky Veterans Program Trust Fund, their sponsorship allowed us to fly 32 WWII Veterans and 3 Korean War Veterans in this WWII bomber which was built in 1944 and is owned by the Commemorative Air Force out of St. Louis, MO. Our goal was to honor our treasured WWII Veterans by flying this WWII airplane across Kentucky and give these members of our Greatest Generation an opportunity to fly in it at no charge.


Proud to announce that we are returning to our mission of escorting WWII, Korea and Vietnam Veterans to visit their Memorials in Washington, DC.
